

**A Resolution of the
Mountaintop Area Joint Sanitary Authority
Adopting the
Rules and Regulations Governing Industrial Sewer Use**

WHEREAS, in a formal commitment to environmental sustainability and water resource protection, the Mountaintop Area Joint Sanitary Authority chooses to implement and enforce a Pretreatment Program to control discharges from all non-domestic users of its wastewater treatment system pursuant to certain requirements set forth in 40 CFR Part 403; and

WHEREAS, Rice, Wright, and Fairview Township consider it to be in the best interest of its citizens to adopt the Pretreatment Program's Rules and Regulations Governing Industrial Sewer Use which subjects the non-domestic, industrial sewage users within its boundaries to the required pretreatment controls, and also empowers and authorizes MAJSA to implement, enforce and update, from time to time, those certain Rules and Regulations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that:

1. The Mountaintop Area Joint Sanitary Authority shall administer the Rules and Regulations Governing Industrial Sewer Use as promulgated by MAJSA and amended and updated from time to time by MAJSA. A true and correct copy of the most recent Rules and Regulations, dated May, 2008, are attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

2. No non-domestic user shall contribute, cause to be contributed or discharge any non-domestic waste into the public sanitary sewage facilities of MAJSA, except in accordance with the said Rules and Regulations.

3. Owners of any non-domestic facilities discharging or contributing wastewater to the public sanitary sewage system shall obtain a permit with certain designated limitations for such discharge as issued, enforced and maintained by MAJSA.

4. MAJSA shall perform such technical and administrative duties necessary to implement and enforce these Industrial Sewer Use Rules and Regulations, including, but not limited to:

- (1) perform and update an Industrial Waste Survey;
- (2) issue permits to all non-domestic users required to obtain

such permits;

- (3) conduct inspections, sampling and analysis from the industrial user in furtherance of enforcement of these Rules and Regulations;
- (4) take all appropriate enforcement actions as outlined in MAJSA's enforcement response plan;
- (5) take any and all emergency actions necessary to stop or prevent any discharge which presents or may present an imminent danger to the health or welfare of humans, which reasonably appears to threaten the environment, or which threatens to cause interference, pass through, or sludge contamination of the MAJSA wastewater treatment system; and
- (6) perform other technical or administrative duties deemed appropriate for the enforcement of these Rules and Regulations.

CONFLICTS

Any Resolution, or part of any Resolution, which may be in conflict with the provisions of this Resolution, by and the same are hereby repealed insofar as the same may conflict with the provisions of the Resolution.
